Lakeside Haven

The homeowners chose to keep this original, small, rustic 1940s camp on the property where they were building their new home. The project focused on repairing the structure while melding the past with the present. By preserving the original stone fireplace, open rafters, and beams, the renovation captured the beloved camp feel while creating a more functional and modern hangout spot. The homeowners wanted to create distinct entertaining zones while maintaining an open, uncrowded feel. This is the primary dining spot for large groups, to keep the main house from being overrun. Durability was key for this high-traffic space, so all fabrics were chosen for high performance, a practical decision that ensures nothing feels too precious for a lively crowd.

Architect Anne Callender used “spider” light fixtures that became a central feature throughout the cabin, with over ten individual cords and bulbs suspended from the high ceilings to create focused light and ambiance. A custom-built table from Lovejoy Rustic Furniture uses various reclaimed timbers, frame styles, and finishes. “It is beautifully contrasted with ten sleek, black steel dining chairs from Design With Reach that introduce a modern, industrial touch to balance the rustic warmth of the wood,” says designer Robin Davis. Found items from the cabin are displayed on the fireplace and share a space with an old exterior shutter that once belonged to the cottage and now holds a custom drawing by architect Joe Delany. The artwork features the clients as two loons and their four children as evergreen trees.
